## A Visitor's Point of View

I recently spent a few days fishing with Kevin Moore south of Queenstown. This was an area that I had driven through previously and was looking forward to exploring with a fishing rod and some time to spare. A couple of days on the Mataura (plenty of fish seen, but not many landed) brought home to me the sheer number of international and local anglers fishing this famous river. It was rare to find an empty access point, and even that did not guarantee the absence of other anglers on "your" stretch of the river. Obviously this caused mixed feelings, given that I'm an Aussie imposter and am no different from the thousands of other anglers that descend on the South Island every summer. However, coming from an area in Australia with not many streams, and even fewer with quality fishing, the pressure on the famous South Island fishery still doesn't seem that bad. I'm sure from a local point of view it seems horrendous, though!

So it was with some excitement that we turned off the road between Kingston

and Garston to head into the Nevis valley. This was reportedly a river that received less fishing pressure by virtue of being "off the beaten track". The drive in over the southern end of the Hector Mountains was spectacular. We then dropped down into the Nevis valley and followed the river from its source until it became fishable. The tussock flats in the valley, the many crystal clear streams running into the river and the lack of human traffic brought home that you don't need to travel far to get away from the crowds. As we travelled down the valley, the history of man's involvement in this area revealed itself through the numerous gold mining huts and tailings. To me, an international visitor, this was the New Zealand that first attracted me and keeps me coming back.

After a great afternoon in the valley we travelled out over the highest public road in New Zealand and back to civilisation in Cromwell. On the drive out, Kev mentioned that there were plans to dam the river and flood the Nevis valley for hydro power. My immediate reaction was horror, however, as I reflected on the reasons behind this plan I could plainly see that from an economic standpoint it made plenty of sense. There would be

hundreds of jobs created by this project, with relatively few economic drawbacks. More jobs, more stored water, more irrigation, more power. It just made sense, didn't it? Well, not really. The tourism trend in New Zealand today is away from packaged tours and towards exploration. In other words, more and more tourists are seeking out an experience that involves a pristine environment, a quality outdoor experience and a sense of the history of the local people. To me the Nevis Valley provides all of this and more.

So does it really make sense to keep reducing the areas where this experience is available? As a privileged visitor, I sincerely hope not. If the land that makes New Zealand different from all other travel destinations is gone, then people will go else where. This would be a tragedy, as my experience is of a place and people that are definitely worth visiting. Certainly, this is an issue that deserves plenty of debate and I hope delivers a decision that is not only based on "economic viability".

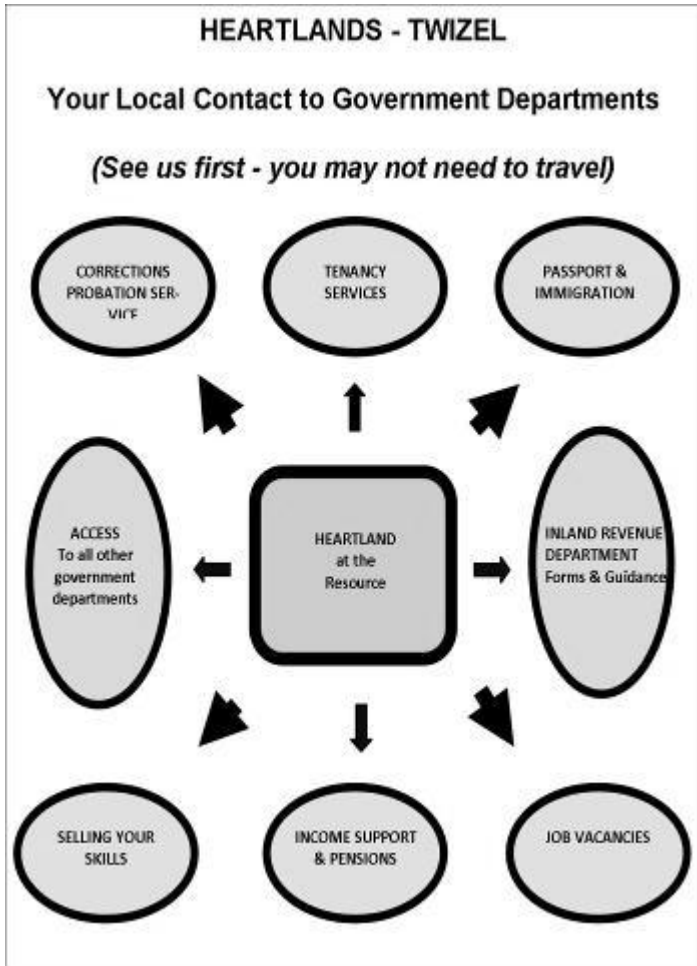

## **Pukaki Airfield Update**

**Rapid progress is being made on the installation of aviation fuel services at Pukaki Airfield.**

The recently installed tank is now being wired up by Fuelquip - technicians Mark Richards and Richard Dolan of Christchurch have been on-site completing this work prior to a fill-

ing test. Timaru contractor Bruce Sim has completed the aircraft refuelling pad drainage grating prior to sealing off the taxiway approaching the pad. Substantial drainage and fuel spill capture systems have been put in place as part of conditions of a consent for the facility. The facility should be completed by the end of the month.

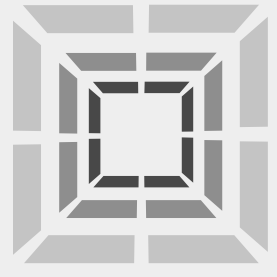

## Salmon & Wine Fest Update

**With the Salmon Festival well and truly over, I thought it is only appropriate to write a few words about the Festival and how it went.**

First of all, I have to thank Kieran from Poppies for organising the Chefs for our cooking displays. Kieran took on this role to organise the 3 restaurants involved which somewhat lessened the weight on this side of the organising the festival. Next, of course, to thank are the salmon suppliers themselves, being Mt Cook Salmon and High Country Salmon.

The volunteers on the day and the stall participants all add up to making our festival great. If it weren't for any of the above then the festival simply wouldn't happen.

When Graham Hughes passed the festival on to Diane and myself, we didn't really have any idea what we had got ourselves into. Although we had been a long time supporters of the festival, this didn't really make up for the amount of time involved in getting it up

and running, as we found out. Fortunately, Diane took up the role of writing to the stallholders and getting this side of things underway. As for me, well, I was just the dog on the day and got to run around and fix up all the problems, and yes, there was plenty to deal with.

In regards to how it went - we were pleased that numbers were on a par with previous years, which also reflected on takings at the gate.

Once all the accounts are paid, a portion of the profits will be distributed to local charity with the remainder to be re-invested back into the festival for years to come. In the past the festival relied heavily on charity to get it off the ground. This year it was pivotal that the festival stood on its own 2 feet

and made some profit after expenses. Once all the accounts are in we are expecting to retain around \$2000 for money in the bank. Incidentally it costs around \$5000 to run. Hence there is always a certain amount of risk associated with festivals of this type.

As for next year, we will re-evaluate things and plan a course ahead as the year progresses.

... Joy Paterson & James Leslie

We are sitting in the morning sunshine as we write this; gently murmuring sounds of the Frazer River and birdsong in the background and looking forward to another 30° plus, day. People ask us why we moved to Twizel – but if we tell them won't everyone want to move here? However, our story is a little more complicated than that.

James is first: My sister in law and her family have had a holiday home here for 30 years. It has been enjoyed by the families of the Paterson clan so much that the often-discussed dream was that all 3 sisters would retire here – one day! We even planned where we would live. Well, that time has finally arrived.

One day in October 05, when Joy and I were at a conference in Queenstown, we heard that 'our section' was on the market. We immediately hired a car, drove to Twizel and bought it. And so it began!

The other 2 sisters, Jan Cowan and Gay Compton, then purchased nearby sections – which happened to be on either side of the Busbridge's, so now Pam has been adopted as a Paterson sister.

And so the process of extraction from city life began. Joy and I were first to sell up and build here, arriving in August 07; soon to be followed by Gay and her husband David later this

year. After that, Jan and Bruce will move north from Invercargill (Jan has more or less moved here already!).

Auckland is where Joy and I most recently lived, where we owned a hotel and lived in an attached apartment. I managed the hotel and Joy did business consulting work. Prior to that, we both worked in various management roles. One of my jobs was to manage the clinical training budgets for 250 house surgeons, registrars and specialists at Auckland Healthcare plus nurses on clinical training and all staff induction at all 4 hospitals in the DHB. Then, at Environmental Science & Research I was responsible for all resources (including 120 scientists) needed for the Police Forensic Science contract and human resources for Environmental Science in Auckland.

I met Joy on a blind date in Christchurch 25 years ago when I was an instructor in the RNZAF officer training school and Joy was a Deputy Principal at Cashmere High School. Other things I did in the Air Force included cold weather, jungle and sea survival instruction and I was a member of the Combined Services marathon team. **Central South Island  
Fishing Report**

Finally all salmon rivers are fishable! I have just got back from leave and before I left I was wondering how long the rivers would stay dirty for. It seemed rivers would be just about perfect and then we would get another Norwest downpour thwarting angler plans. Salmon fishing has therefore been difficult, but if the long range forecast is correct we shouldn't see any more rain for some time.

Even when water has been fishable the Rangitata has not really fired apart from a run early in the season. There have only been a few days when fish have been found in abundance by anglers. Some of our smaller rivers have been quietly producing fish such as the Orari, Opihi and Ashburton although the Opihi would be the pick

of the bunch at the moment.

Some lowland rivers are getting dangerously low and as such trout usually become more difficult to catch. Careful presentations are needed to secure these fish as by now they will have seen a few hopeful anglers. Often fish are wary by day but let their guard down at night so

fishing at this time can be productive. High country waters would be my pick for the weekend with good weather predicted. The Tekapo should fish well after receiving a recent fresh which should have knocked the didymo back somewhat. I always find this time of year to be great for fly fishing, fewer anglers are about and trout suck down big bushy dries more readily.

Having wet the line six times already this season without so much as a touch I think I may have to venture out this weekend and see if I can't find a willing salmon.

## Council Briefs

### ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM THE LAST COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON FRIDAY 29 JANUARY 2010

#### EFFORTS OF TWIZEL SPORTS WOMAN HONoured

The Council passed a resolution congratulating Twizel resident Kylie Wakelin who was a member of the Commonwealth Ladies Ski Exhibition which recently trekked across Antarctica to the South Pole. She is the first New Zealand woman to ski to the South Pole. As well as congratulating Kylie, the Council has agreed her achievement should be recognized at a Council sponsored public function to be organized in Twizel shortly.

#### PROPOSED AORAKI MOUNT COOK – TEKAPO STARLIGHT RESERVE

The Council noted that the Starlight Reserve Committee is producing a newsletter regarding the proposed Starlight Reserve in order to keep local people informed about developments. It was also suggested that the lighting ordinances in Council's District Plan could be extended to include Twizel, thus increasing the area covered by the Starlight Reserve. Councillors were receptive to this idea.

#### CHANGE IN MEETING SCHEDULES

The Council will now hold its Committee and full Council meetings on Fridays rather than Tuesdays following consideration of the meeting schedules through to the end of the term. It was agreed that the change in day would better suit the work requirements of elected members.

#### GRANT COMMITTEES APPOINTED

Council has determined the membership of new committees to distribute monies to local organisations throughout the District. The Creative Communities Committee has authority to allocate grants totalling \$7,000 this year. The Community Boards will be enlisted to promote the Creative Communities Scheme Fund and encourage groups and individuals to apply for assistance.

The Council has also determined the membership of the assessment group for the 2010 SPARC Rural Travel Fund for sporting and recreational groups. It will have \$9,000 to allocate.

#### EXTERNAL SUBMISSIONS ENDORSED

The Mayor obtained the endorsement of Council for submissions sent to the Canterbury Regional Council on its draft Regional Transport Strategy and its proposal to charge additional amounts to holders of water consents.

Council also endorsed some further comments made to the Hon Wyatt Creech, who has been chairing the enquiry into the operation of the Canterbury Regional Council.

#### COUNCIL QUERIES TRANSFER OF DAM OWNERSHIP

The Council has some concerns about the recent Ministerial decisions taken to im-

prove electricity market performance. In particular, the proposal to transfer the Tekapo A and B power stations from Meridian Energy to Genesis Energy has the Council baffled. The proposal also involves the transfer of the government owned Whirinaki Plant to Meridian Energy and virtual asset swaps of North Island and South Island power among Meridian Energy, Mighty River Power and Genesis Energy.

The Council is unsure how splitting an integrated system for running the Waitaki hydro system will work in practice. It also is worried that a range of local issues may have not been taken into account in reaching the government decision. Questions such as the holding of vital resource consents, control of lake levels, access to canal roads and rating matters could have significant effect on the people of the Mackenzie District.

The Council is to write to the relevant Ministers and local Member of Parliament expressing these concerns.

#### SOLID WASTE OPERATION

An independent review of Council's Solid Waste Operations has been prepared and will be considered by Council at its next Operations Committee in February and possibly further at a later workshop.

#### MANAGEMENT AND OPERATION OF RURAL WATER SUPPLIES

Council considered a draft consultation document on this matter and agreed to distribute it to interested ratepayers and have discussions with them at meetings of the local water supply committees later in the year. Council is concerned to recover the full costs of services provided to each water supply and wants to investigate transferring the management of such supplies from Council to individual groups of ratepayers.

#### MORE FUNDING PROPOSED FOR RURAL FIRE AUTHORITY

The Council has endorsed a proposed purchase agreement between South Canterbury Rural Fire Authority and the national body which will make the authority eligible for an annual grant of just under \$64,500 plus GST. The proposal is part of a wider government movement to offer incentives to rural fire districts to amalgamate. Having amalgamated already for fire purposes, the South Canterbury councils will still reap the benefit of the government's change in policy.

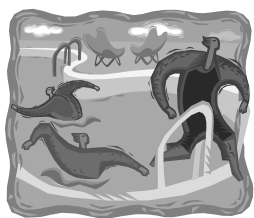
